VI. Overall Evaluation/Results (Be Specific): Overall, this was an unsuccessful project. Originally, the shirts were priced at \$20 (which assumed about 15 shirts would be ordered). Only 4 members were interested, which raised the price to \$35 per shirt, and 3 of the 4 interested members backed out. We did not raise any money.
