

## Executive Council Nominations

Dear Tau Bates:

We invite you to nominate alumni to serve on the Executive Council for the 2021-23 term. The candidates will be introduced and stand for election at the Convention in Atlanta, GA, October 22-24, 2020. The Association provides on-site plus most travel expenses for all candidates.

The procedures for election and the responsibilities of the Executive Council are spelled out in the Constitution and Bylaws, particularly Constitution Article X, Sections 1-5.

Any chapter or group of chapters, collegiate or alumni, may nominate one or more candidates. The nominating chapter or chapters must obtain from each nominee his or her acceptance and agreement to serve actively if elected. Each member of the Executive Council serves for three years. The Executive Councillors should plan to attend three in-person Council meetings each year, additional virtual meetings, the annual Convention each fall, and other events as needed.

Executive Councillors are not compensated for their services, but are reimbursed for expenses connected with their TBP work and travel.

While not constitutional requirements, members of the Executive Council tend to:

- 1) Exhibit a genuine interest in serving Tau Beta Pi;
- 2) Make time to attend District Conferences, chapter inspections, and installations;
- 3) Represent a cross-section of the Association including members of different chapters;
- 4) Possess experience in a variety of professional functions and activities such as employer and employee, private and public service, in technical, management, academic, research, or other fields.

In accordance with Constitution Article X, Section 1-5, nominations are to be made to Headquarters by July 1. Additional material including a brief biography and photograph of the nominee should be sent to Headquarters by the nominee no later than August 1.
